BACKGROUND

Saint Munchin's Catholic Primary School is a co-educational primary school catering for approximately 400 students from Kindergarten to Year Six. Located in the City of Gosnells, St Munchin's is committed to providing enriched learning opportunities enabling children to develop to their full potential.

The school is focused on good teaching and learning and actively uses student data from a variety of sources to enhance the classroom experience. The school offers a comprehensive learning programme with support and extension opportunities available to all students. Ongoing school improvement is a strong focus.

The school also assists parents in preparing each child to contribute positively to their local community, having particular awareness of the needs of, and responsibility to, the wider Church. A particularly strong working relationship has been established with the Parish to support all students and families.
